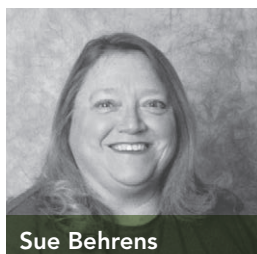

VARIETY GRANT HELPS CHILDREN RECEIVE NEEDED THERAPY

ZACH HAYDEN

Zach Hayden is one of the children who benefitted from the 2012 Variety grant. Zach is the son of Dominic and Samantha Hayden of Linden. Samantha says as a baby, he wasn't making sounds or mimicking words spoken to him.

"When he was 16 months old, I asked his doctor about it and was told not to worry, that boys talk later than girls. When I raised the issue again a couple of months later, I was told I should try harder to MAKE him talk," she says. "That ended up with both of us in tears, but still no words."

As Zach approached his second birthday without talking, he entered an AEA early intervention program. A therapist who worked with him a few times said she could tell Zach was smart and wanted to talk, but couldn't. A second AEA therapist then did an evaluation, and suspected he had childhood apraxia of speech.

Children with apraxia of speech have problems saying sounds, syllables and words. It's not because of muscle weakness or paralysis, but rather a scrambling of motor sequences in the brain.

Once there was a diagnosis, the AEA therapist recommended Timber Creek Therapies. The Hayden family lives just 15 miles from the therapy center. "She said even if we lived in Des Moines, she would recommend we come to Timber Creek," Samantha says.

Zach has received therapy at Timber Creek twice a week for nearly two years. Riding a horse stimulates his spinal column and brain. That makes it a good time for his speech therapist, Cindy McCarty, to work with him.

It's not just the actual therapy session that helps Zach, Samantha says. "He likes riding the horses, and that motivates him to try even harder."

One activity involves placing plastic animals on a tray balanced on the horse's neck in front of Zach. Cindy starts with a tray full of horses, since horses are favorites. Zach is asked to do several things, such as count the horses, pick out the spotted horses and so on.

Other animals are substituted for the horses—a giraffe, an elephant, a lion—and Zach identifies and counts these new animals.

Then it's time to ride around the arena again, with stops for new activities. Zach works on sounds, responses to a series of three commands, and answers questions from Cindy and the two assistants helping with the horse and Zach. After each stop, Zach is in charge of telling the horse to move again, with a "walk on" command.

McCarty says childhood apraxia isn't common, which is one reason it was difficult for the Hayden family to get a diagnosis. And once they got the diagnosis, they were told Zach might never talk.

"But he's made tremendous progress," McCarty says. "He's very verbal now and doing extremely well. This is a long and tedious process, but if he continues to get the therapy he needs, I believe it is possible for him to achieve completely functional communication and language skills."

The family's insurance policy paid for one year of therapy, but coverage beyond that first year was denied. After an appeal, just four additional therapy sessions were approved.

That's when the Variety money, funneled through Timber Creek Charities, came to Zach's rescue. Now the Haydens pay \$5 per session and Variety funds cover the rest.

Samantha says Zach has made "tons of progress" since coming to Timber Creek. "We are so grateful, both for the therapy he has received, and also for the financial help when insurance stopped paying," she says. "If you look back over the long-term, I know Zach wouldn't have made it so far without the help of Timber Creek."

Variety—The Children's Charity of Iowa is dedicated to improving the lives of Iowa children. In 2012, and for the sixth year in a row, Variety provided \$10,000 to Timber Creek Charities to help children receive needed therapy.

CONTRIBUTIONS TO TIMBER CREEK CHARITIES COME FROM TWO SOURCES

The volunteer hours of a Panora woman led to Timber Creek Charities receiving donations from two sources.

Melanie Parker has worked the past 17 years for Wellmark, Inc., in downtown Des Moines. Currently she is a senior business analyst in the claims division.

In 2011, Parker decided to participate in BluesCare Giving, a philanthropy program that combines traditional and innovative elements of both volunteer and matching gifts programs.

"I've always been an active volunteer," Parker says. "This program encourages Wellmark employees across Iowa and South Dakota to volunteer in their local communities. Employees can get paid time off to volunteer for up to 24 hours for qualifying nonprofits. The company also encourages us to use our personal time to volunteer."

For every eight hours of personal time spent volunteering for a qualifying group, Wellmark employees can have \$250 sent directly to a charity of their choice. Employees can earn up to \$10,000 per year for charity.

Parker had already been volunteering at the Food Bank of Iowa, Meals from the Heartland, and closer to home, the Yale Saddle Club. She decided to keep track of her ongoing volunteer hours, and designate some of the money to Timber Creek Charities.

Parker chose Timber Creek Charities for a variety of reasons. "My daughter had equine therapy elsewhere in the past, so I know the benefits," she says. "I also liked the fact it is local. My daughter helped a friend who was a volunteer there, so we've known about Timber Creek for a couple of years."

Also, the Parkers are members of the Yale Saddle Club, which means they are horse lovers, another reason Melanie wanted to help Timber Creek. In 2011, Parker designated eight hours of her volunteer work for Timber Creek Charities, which received a check for \$250 in January 2012 for her efforts. As she continued to track her volunteer hours throughout 2012, the dollar figure grew.

In July, Timber Creek received a \$2,000 check because of Parker's volunteer hours. Another check for \$5,500 arrived in December.

In addition to raising money for Timber Creek Charities through her employer, Parker was instrumental in the Yale Saddle Club presenting a \$460 check to Cindy McCarty, the founder and director of Timber Creek.

Parker is the vice president of the Yale Saddle Club. She, her husband Pat Parker, daughter Brittany Johnson, and son Nicholas Parker, all are club members. While the family doesn't own horses, Parker says they are "blessed with friends who have horses. We've had some awesome family experiences being members of the club. It offers a real family atmosphere."

The club holds about 10 shows each season, plus an annual trail ride. In past years, club members have chosen a charity to which all proceeds from its final show are donated. In 2012, Parker proposed raising money for Timber Creek Charities and club members agreed.

New that year was the decision to raise money throughout the season, in addition to proceeds from the final show. A bucket for freewill donations was available at the cook shack during each show, as well as the two-day trail ride. The club's Facebook page promoted the fundraising effort throughout the season.

The club's largest show is held in conjunction with Yale's annual Fourth of July celebration. At that show, McCarty was given an opportunity to talk about Timber Creek, and posters showing some patients receiving therapy were on display.

The club's final 2012 show was held October 6. Proceeds from that event, a raffle and money raised throughout the season, made the \$460 donation possible.

"We are grateful for Melanie's amazing personal contributions and dedication to Timber Creek Charities, and for the donations from the entire Yale Saddle Club," says McCarty. "We also are grateful to Wellmark for their wonderful program and contributions. So many people of all ages will benefit directly from these combined generosities. "

The 11th annual Timber Creek Charities golf tournament held July 21, 2012, at Lake Panorama National raised nearly **\$50,000**. Four corporate sponsors provided a total of **\$19,000**.

BROKERS INTERNATIONAL, LTD., has been an annual sponsor since the first tournament in 2002. That company donated **\$5,000** in 2012, bringing its 11-year total to **\$48,000**.

A total of 124 golfers participated in the four-person, best-ball tournament. There were 31 companies and individuals who donated \$100 each as tee box sponsors. Golfers participated by paying \$75 each for lunch, golf, prizes and dinner. Many more supporters, including Timber Creek patients and their families, attended the dinner.

The Timber Creek Charities golf tournament held July 21 at Lake Panorama National raised nearly \$50,000. Four corporate sponsors provided a total of \$19,000.

After dinner, guest speakers included family members of three people who had passed away recently and designated Timber Creek Charities for memorial donations. JULIE DIMITRI

Julie Dimitri did not have the chance to visit Timber Creek Therapies, yet her husband, George Dimitri, knows she would be pleased to be able to contribute to such a worthy cause. Julie had a way of touching the lives of everyone she encountered whether it was through her witty sense of humor, positive attitude, great advice or loving disposition. So it seems apropos that she continues to impact others at Timber Creek Therapies through the memorial contributions made in her honor.



George is a member of the Timber Creek Charities board of directors and was a long-time friend of Don Gillespie, who was instrumental in helping Cindy McCarty develop her Timber Creek Therapies dream. "I got to know Cindy after Don passed away," George says. "Don had talked to me about Cindy and Timber Creek, and I knew it was important to him."

Julie and George met in college at Iowa State and married shortly thereafter in 1969. They started their 40+ year marriage in Chicago where George worked in the construction industry and Julie worked in advertising and the nonprofit sector. Before long, Julie and George moved to a suburb of Chicago—Naperville—where Julie found her true calling as a devoted mother to their three children, Michel, Jamie and Dana.

"Julie went above and beyond as a mother. She was instrumental in shaping our children into who they are today. We are a close-knit family because of her constant love and support," says George. Julie was diagnosed with breast cancer at the age of 35. "She prayed she could live long enough to raise her kids, and was able to do that," he says. "She really loved her kids."

Once their children went off to college, Julie and George moved back to Chicago where they enjoyed city life, whether trying the new, local brunch spot or walking along Lake Michigan. Julie loved taking road trips to visit her sons Michel and Jamie in New York City or daughter Dana in Dallas before she moved home when Julie got sick.

Julie was a fighter, both strong and brave. She survived breast cancer (age 35) and melanoma (age 58). During her two-year battle with brain cancer, she never lost her sense of humor and continued to make others smile. Julie passed away on August 7, 2012. "I know Julie would be pleased to have her memorial money benefit the work being done at Timber Creek," George says.

A total of \$7,505 was donated to Timber Creek Charities in memory of Julie Dimitri.

DAVE WOLF

Dave Wolf was deer hunting in November 2007 when his tree stand broke, dropping him 12 feet. He suffered numerous injuries, including spinal cord damage that left him paralyzed from the chest down.

Wolf spent 60 days at Mercy Hospital in Des Moines, followed by 40 days in an Omaha rehab facility. He and his wife Wanda had been living on an acreage near Exira, but it wasn't handicap-accessible. So Wanda moved them into an apartment in town, and Dave was able to come home.

Wanda had worked in human services in Carroll, and knew some people who had received assistance from Timber Creek Therapies. Sue Behrens, a Timber Creek physical therapist, began providing in-home therapy for Dave.

Eventually he was strong enough to travel to Timber Creek, at first making the 50-mile roundtrip from Exira, and later the 90-mile roundtrip from Atlantic.

Behrens worked with Dave twice a week. "Dave felt like she was family," Wanda says. "She is good at knowing her clients' personality and how to work with them."

Wanda says Dave benefitted from all the therapy options available at Timber Creek. "He had to strengthen his core, so he could balance his body from the chest up," she says. "Once Sue got his core working great, he could ride a horse."

Dave was able to keep his leg muscles toned on the motorized cycle that utilizes Functional Electrical Stimulation (FES). FES stimulates nerves to evoke patterned movement of the legs. Wanda says Dave liked the FES bike. He also liked therapy sessions in the warm-water indoor pool.

"We both loved it there," Wanda says. "Everyone we dealt with was so positive, it gave us hope. Just being around other people was important. Dave

would see other people with disabilities, and it gave him more motivation."

Dave received services from Timber Creek Therapies for three years, until internal infections related to his paralysis became an issue. He was hospitalized off and on from December 2011 until his passing October 10, 2012.



Wanda says she and Dave never talked specifically about having his memorial money go to Timber Creek Charities, but they had talked about what a wonderful place it is and if they could make a donation there, they would. "We just really loved Timber Creek," she says.

A total of \$3,998 was donated to Timber Creek Charities in memory of Dave Wolf.

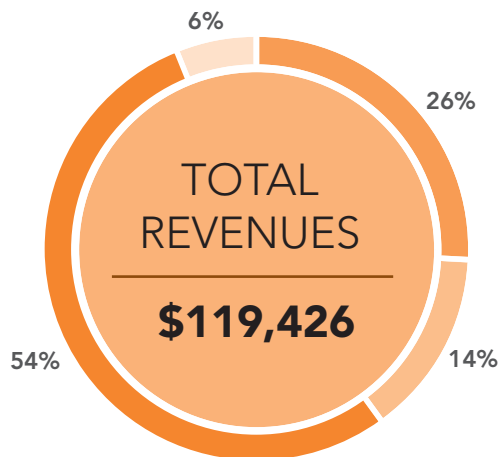

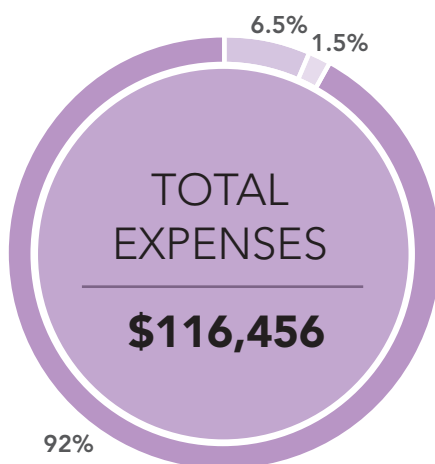
